for the command in accordance with policies of this headquarters; provide printing service for the command, and furnish distribution of publications to this headquarters.

- n. Provide facilities, supplies and services for a Prisoner of War camp.
- o. Operate the AAF Regional Station Hospital, OAAB.
- p. Operate and administer the 584th AAF Band in accordance with directives of this and higher headquarters.

20. 903rd AAF Base Unit (PAAF). The 903rd AAF Base Unit (PAAF) contains the personnel to operate Pinecastle Army Air Field. In addition to the duties, responsibilities and authority of a "Post Commander" as outlined in AR 210-10, the Commanding Officer, 903rd AAF Base Unit (PAAF) is charged with the following specific responsibilities:

- a. Provide base administration, supplies and services for all units stationed at Pinecastle Army Air Field and such other units as may be directed by the Commanding General, AFTAC.
- b. Within current War Department, AAF and AFTAC Directives and Regulations, control all supply, maintenance, transportation and construction and utilities activities at Pinecastle Army Air Field and call directly upon the Commanding Officer, Orlando Army Air Base, for such routine services in this connection that are beyond the capacity of the facilities at his Field. He is authorized to initiate and approve projects for repairs and utilities and new construction up to \$1,000 for Pinecastle Army Air Field from funds allocated for this purpose by the Commanding General, AFTAC.
- c. Organize operationally as a group as well as a base.
- d. Maintain, schedule and control the Cedar Keys Bombing and Gunnery Range and PAAF Gunnery Range to include the operation of such boats as are assigned to 903rd AAF Base Unit (PAAF).
- e. Conduct AAFSAT Demonstrations (to include providing any training or operational facilities of PAAF), AAF Board Projects and other training and operational missions as directed by this Headquarters.

21. 904th AAF Base Unit (KAAF). The 904th AAF Base Unit (KAAF) contains the personnel to operate Kissimmee Army Air Field. In addition to the duties, responsibilities and authority of a "Post Commander" as outlined in AR 210-10, the Commanding Officer, 904th AAF Base Unit (KAAF) is charged with the following specific responsibilities:

- a. Provide base administration, supplies and services for all units stationed at Kissimmee Army Air Field and such other units as may be directed by the Commanding General, AFTAC.
