
Reference is made to your letter received on September 7, 2007, in which you requested to modify the Department of the Army permit number SAJ-2001-5549 (IP-AAZ) issued to the Florida Department of Transportation on October 21, 2002. The work was originally authorized for the Miami Intermodal Center and includes the replacement of the existing LeJeune Road Bridge and associated ramps over the Tamiami Canal (C-4). The project was modified on August 28, 2003, to re-adjust the location of piers, re-configure the canal, and install an outfall structure. The project was modified again on December 11, 2003, to re-align the intermediate bent of Bridge Number 10, install a flow diverter, and install manatee grates in two outfalls. The project is located along LeJeune Road in Sections 29, 31, and 32; Township 53 South; Range 41 East; Miami-Dade County, Florida.

The original permit expires on October 21, 2007. Your letter requests to extend the permit until October 21, 2008, to ensure the construction will be complete. Although it is anticipated that the construction would be completed by March 31, 2008, additional time is needed to account for unexpected delays.

The impacts of the modification on the environment have been evaluated and found to be insignificant. The permit is hereby modified as described above. All other conditions of the permit remain in effect. You should attach this letter to the permit.
