MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Supplement to the Department of the Army Environmental Assessment and Statement of Findings for the Above-Numbered Permit Application.

- 1. Applicant:** Florida Department of Transportation, District 5
- 2. Reason for supplement:** Construction delays have not allowed the contractor to complete authorized impacts to waters of the United States.
- 3. Original Authorized Project:** The applicant received a Department of the Army permit to impact 1.08 acres of waters of the United States (wetlands) for the construction of a stormwater management system to serve the widening of County Road (CR) 516 (Palm Bay Road) between Minton Road to R.J Conlan Blvd (FPN 241221-1-32-01).
- 4. Endangered Species:** The Corps is unaware of any federally listed species within the project corridor. It is the Corps determination that the proposed project will have "no affect" on any Federally threatened or endangered species.
- 5. Essential Fish Habitat (EFH):** The Corps determined the proposed modification will have "no effect" on EFH as the project is not located within EFH.
- 6. Mitigation:** No mitigation will be required for the proposed modification.
- 7. Special Conditions:** No additional special conditions are required.
- 8. Determination:** I have reviewed all the pertinent information and have concluded that the determinations of the permit evaluation are still valid and there have been no significant changes in the circumstances surrounding this permit since the final determination was made. Therefore, the conclusion that the permit is not contrary to the public interest, that it complies with the 404(b)(1) Guidelines, and that an Environmental Impact Statement is not required is still valid.
