NOTE: The term "you" and its derivatives, as used in this permit, means the permittee or any future transferee. The term "this office" refers to the appropriate district or division office of the Corps of Engineers having jurisdiction over the permitted activity or the appropriate official of that office acting under the authority of the commanding officer.

You are authorized to perform work in accordance with the terms and conditions specified below.

**Project Description:** The placement of clean fill material into 1.98 acres of waters of the United States (wetlands) (FPN # 220499-1-52-01). The work described above is to be completed in accordance with the 4 attachments affixed at the end of this permit instrument.

**Project Location:** The project is the replacement of the State Road 30 (SR 30) (US 98) bridge over the Wakulla River. The project will impact wetlands abutting the Wakulla River. The project is located in Section 32, Township 02 South, Range 01 East, Wakulla River Bridge.

**Directions to site:** From the City of St Marks, Florida proceed north on Port Leon Drive to the intersection of SR 30 (US 98). Turn west on SR 30 and head to the Wakulla River.

## Permit Conditions

### General Conditions:

1. The time limit for completing the work authorized ends on **November 4, 2013**. If you find that you need more time to complete the authorized activity, submit your request for a time extension to this office for consideration at least one month before the above date is reached.

2. You must maintain the activity authorized by this permit in good condition and in conformance with the terms and conditions of this permit. You are not relieved of this requirement if you abandon the permitted activity, although you may make a good faith transfer to a third party in compliance with General Condition 4 below. Should you wish to cease to maintain the authorized activity or should you desire to abandon it without a good faith transfer, you must obtain a modification of this permit from this office, which may require restoration of the area.

3. If you discover any previously unknown historic or archeological remains while accomplishing the activity authorized by this permit, you must immediately notify this office of what you have found. We will initiate the Federal and State coordination required to determine if the remains warrant a recovery effort or if the site is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.

4. If you sell the property associated with this permit, you must obtain the signature and the mailing address of the new owner in the space provided and forward a copy of the permit to this office to validate the transfer of this authorization.

5. If a conditioned water quality certification has been issued for your project, you must comply with the conditions specified in the certification as special conditions to this permit. For your convenience, a copy of the certification is attached if it contains such conditions.

6. You must allow representatives from this office to inspect the authorized activity at any time deemed necessary to

ensure that it is being or has been accomplished in accordance with the terms and conditions of your permit.

**Special Conditions:**

1. All reports, documentation and correspondence required by the conditions of this permit shall be submitted to the following address: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Regulatory Division, Enforcement Section, P.O. Box 4970, Jacksonville, FL 32232. The Permittee shall reference this permit number, SAJ-2007-5337(IP-AWP), on all submittals.
2. The Permittee shall use only clean fill material for this project. The fill material shall be free from items such as trash, debris, automotive parts, asphalt, construction materials, concrete block with exposed reinforcement bars, and soils contaminated with any toxic substance, in toxic amounts in accordance with Section 307 of the Clean Water Act.
3. Wetland impacts for this project will be mitigated through the Northwest Florida Umbrella, Watershed-Based, Regional Mitigation Plan (PLAN), as defined in the agreement between the Northwest Florida Water Management District (NFWFMD) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps), Jacksonville District, July 31, 2006.
4. Within 12 months from the effective date of this permit, the Permittee shall provide verification to the Corps that approximately 11 acres of wetlands (sinkholes and associated forested wetlands) and approximately 2 acres of high-quality forested uplands have been purchased within the Ferrell Tract to ensure no net loss of wetland function as a result of the proposed project. (UMAM analysis indicates that 2.57 functional units would be achieved through this mitigation acquisition.) The required verification shall reference this project's permit number (SAJ-2007-5337(IP-AWP)).
5. If the compensatory mitigation defined above fails to remain protected in perpetuity at any time after wetland impacts occur at the impact site (Wakulla Bridge Replacement), the compensatory mitigation will be deemed unsuccessful. Within 60 days of notification by the Corps or observation by the Northwest Florida Water Management District (NFWFMD) that the

compensatory mitigation is being utilized for something other than a purely natural area, free of development, the mitigation will be considered unsuccessful. The Permittee or the NFWMD shall submit an alternate compensatory mitigation proposal to the Corps which fully offsets the functional loss that occurred as a result of the project. The alternate compensatory mitigation proposal may be required to include additional mitigation to compensate for the temporal loss of wetland function associated with the unsuccessful compensatory mitigation activities. The Corps reserves the right to fully evaluate, amend, and approve or reject the alternate compensatory mitigation proposal. Within 120 days of Corps approval, the Permittee will complete the alternate compensatory mitigation proposal.

6. Because the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) is unwilling or unable to record a conservation easement or establish other conservation documentation stating the 13 acre mitigation area will be placed in conservation in perpetuity, the Permittee or the NFWMD shall submit an annual monitoring report describing the condition of the mitigation area. The report should be limited to a one page document and associated location map which describes the existing condition of the 13 acre mitigation area and any development encroachments which have been implemented by FDEP or others. All correspondence should include the Department of the Army Permit number.

7. A representative of the Corps will be allowed to inspect the authorized activity and mitigation site at any time deemed necessary to ensure that it is being or has been accomplished in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit.

8. All reports, documentation and correspondence required by the conditions of this permit shall be submitted to the following address: U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Regulatory Division, Enforcement Section, P.O. Box 4970, Jacksonville, FL 32232 and US Army Corps of Engineers, Cocoa Regulatory Field Office, Attn: Andrew Phillips, 400 High Point Drive, Suite 600, Cocoa, Florida 32926.

9. Within 10 days from the date of initiating the authorized work, the Permittee shall provide to the Corps a written

notification of the date of commencement of work authorized by this permit.

10. Prior to the initiation of any work authorized by this permit, the Permittee shall install erosion control measures around all work areas to prevent the displacement of fill material. Immediately after completion of the final grading of the land surface, all slopes, land surfaces, and filled areas adjacent to wetlands shall be stabilized using sod, degradable mats, or a combination of similar stabilizing materials to prevent erosion. The erosion control measures shall remain in place and be maintained until all authorized work has been completed and the site has been stabilized.

11. Within 60 days of completion of the authorized work or at the expiration of the construction window of this permit, whichever occurs first, the Permittee shall submit as-built drawings of the authorized work and a completed As-Built Certification Form (Attachment 3) to the Corps. The drawings shall be signed and sealed by a registered professional engineer and include the following:

a. A plan view drawing of the location of the authorized work footprint (as shown on the permit drawings) with an overlay of the work as constructed in the same scale as the attached permit drawings (8½-inch by 11-inch). The drawing should show all "earth disturbance," including wetland impacts, water management structures, and any on-site mitigation areas.

b. List any deviations between the work authorized by this permit and the work as constructed. In the event that the completed work deviates, in any manner, from the authorized work, describe on the As-Built Certification Form the deviations between the work authorized by this permit and the work as constructed. Clearly indicate on the as-built drawings any deviations that have been listed. Please note that the depiction and/or description of any deviations on the drawings and/or As-Built Certification Form does not constitute approval of any deviations by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

c. The Department of the Army Permit number.

d. Include pre- and post-construction aerial photographs of the project site, if available.

10. The Permittee agrees to follow the Standard Manatee Construction Conditions for In-water Work included as attachment 4.

**Further Information:**

1. Congressional Authorities: You have been authorized to undertake the activity described above pursuant to:

(X) Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 U.S.C. 403).

(X) Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1344).

( ) Section 103 of the Marine Protection, Research and Sanctuaries Act of 1972 (33 U.S.C. 1413).

2. Limits of this authorization.

a. This permit does not obviate the need to obtain other Federal, State, or local authorizations required by law.

b. This permit does not grant any property rights or exclusive privileges.

c. This permit does not authorize any injury to the property or rights of others.

d. This permit does not authorize interference with any existing or proposed Federal projects.

3. Limits of Federal Liability. In issuing this permit, the Federal Government does not assume any liability for the following:

a. Damages to the permitted project or uses thereof as a result of other permitted or unpermitted activities or from natural causes.

b. Damages to the permitted project or uses thereof as a result of current or future activities undertaken by or on behalf of the United States in the public interest.

c. Damages to persons, property, or to other permitted or unpermitted activities or structures caused by the activity authorized by this permit.

d. Design or construction deficiencies associated with the permitted work.

e. Damage claims associated with any future modification, suspension, or revocation of this permit.

4. Reliance on Applicant's Data: The determination of this office that issuance of this permit is not contrary to the public interest was made in reliance on the information you provided.

5. Reevaluation of Permit Decision: This office may reevaluate its decision on this permit at any time the circumstances warrant. Circumstances that could require a reevaluation include, but are not limited to, the following:

a. You fail to comply with the terms and conditions of this permit.

b. The information provided by you in support of your permit application proves to have been false, incomplete, or inaccurate (see 4 above).

c. Significant new information surfaces which this office did not consider in reaching the original public interest decision.

Such a reevaluation may result in a determination that it is appropriate to use the suspension, modification, and revocation procedures contained in 33 CFR 325.7 or enforcement procedures such as those contained in 33 CFR 326.4 and 326.5. The referenced enforcement procedures provide for the issuance of an administrative order requiring you comply with the terms and conditions of your permit and for the initiation of legal action where appropriate. You will be required to pay for any

corrective measures ordered by this office, and if you fail to comply with such directive, this office may in certain situations (such as those specified in 33 CFR 209.170) accomplish the corrective measures by contract or otherwise and bill you for the cost.

6. Extensions: General Condition 1 establishes a time limit for the completion of the activity authorized by this permit. Unless there are circumstances requiring either a prompt completion of the authorized activity or a reevaluation of the public interest decision, the Corps will normally give favorable consideration to a request for an extension of this time limit.
