1. DESCRIPTION

The St. Johns County, FL storm damage reduction project begins approximately 2.5 miles south of the south jetty of St. Augustine Inlet. The purpose of this project is to mitigate for downdrift shoreline impacts caused by the Federal navigation channel at St. Augustine Inlet, and provide storm damage reduction to the upland development. The cost sharing for this project is 80.5 percent Federal and 19.5 percent non-Federal due to the impacts of the Federal navigation channel to the downdrift beaches. The renourishment cycle for the project is every 5 years.

4. STATUS

The project delivery team is currently preparing a Limited Reevaluation Report (LRR) to include an offshore borrow area as a potential borrow area. The LRR draft report will be submitted to South Atlantic Division (SAD) on 2 September 2016 and the Final Report will be submitted on 21 March 2017. The project team continues evaluating monitoring data to revise the erosion rates and quantities. The project delivery team received workplan funding in the amount of \$627,000.00 to prepare plans and specifications, receive permit, and perform surveys of the borrow area and beach placement area. The next renourishment is scheduled for 2017 dependent on construction funding.
