**Fort San Geronimo, PR (103)**  
 Construction (C)  
 Congressional District: Puerto Rico

### 1. DESCRIPTION

The historic fort, San Geronimo, is situated at the northwest limit of the Condado Lagoon in San Juan, Puerto Rico. It was built in the second part of the 16th century and, as such, it served as the principal component of the defense system for that section of the city. In 1957, the fort was transferred in precarious disrepair to the Institute of Puerto Rican Culture (IPRC). In 1996, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) and the IPRC developed a report which concluded that the structural integrity of the fort was deteriorating due to the impact of wave action on the fort's outer walls. In 2005, the Corps and IPRC executed a Feasibility Cost Sharing Agreement and a feasibility report was completed in 2008 under Section 103 of the Continuing Authority Program. The feasibility report presented a concrete grout apron and limited rubble revetment as the recommended plan for construction. The recommended plan also included a coral mitigation feature and monitoring.
