1. DESCRIPTION

The ocean shoreline of St. Johns County is approximately 42 miles long. The St. Johns County shoreline was heavily damaged during the 1999 hurricane season prompting a request to then Congresswoman Tillie Fowler for assistance. The study area includes all of St. Johns County. Extreme erosion north of the St. Augustine Inlet due to the 2004 and 2005 Hurricane seasons has compounded the need for the study.

4. STATUS

A Feasibility Study Cost Sharing Agreement was executed in FY 2004 and the Study was initiated in 2005. A Feasibility Scoping Meeting was held in FY 2011. The cost of the study has increased significantly due to the more data intensive BEACH fx economic model, inclusion of four Agency Technical Reviews and the Independent External Peer Review. Currently there are no federal funds available to continue with the study. St. Johns County has stepped forward requesting that an accelerated funds agreement be prepared which will allow the County to provide up to their share of the feasibility study in advance of receiving additional federal funds. The Congressional notification package required prior to the development of an accelerated funds agreement was submitted to South Atlantic Division for their review in January 2014.
