**St. Lucie Inlet, FL**

**1. DESCRIPTION**

St. Lucie Inlet is located in Martin County on the Atlantic coast of Florida, approximately midway down the state. Section 201 of the Flood Control Act of 1965 authorized the project which provides for a channel 16 foot deep and 300 feet wide, tapering to 10 feet deep and 150 feet wide through the inlet, and a channel 7 feet deep and 100 feet wide between the inlet and the Intracoastal Waterway. Project modifications were authorized in 1974, 1977, and 2000 to include a sediment impoundment basin adjacent to the north jetty, extension of the north jetty (including 500-foot weir section), a detached breakwater immediately south of the entrance channel, and construction of a new south jetty. To date, the only shortfall is that the south jetty was constructed 200 feet short of its authorized length.



The north jetty construction was completed September 2009. The contract has been closed. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Martin County recommend that the south jetty not be extended the additional 200 feet, as authorized. Therefore, construction activities at St. Lucie Inlet are complete.
