



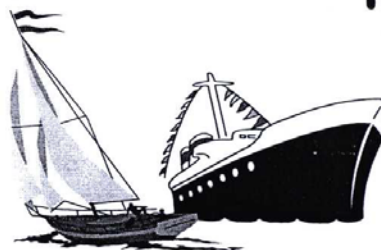

## **NTN 280514 NOTICE TO NAVIGATION INTERESTS REGARDING OWW LOCK RESTRICTIONS DUE TO CHANGES IN LAKE OKEECHOBEE WATER SURFACE LEVELS**

1. Mariners navigating Okeechobee Waterway (OWW) are strongly advised to review the following table of Lock Restrictions that should be taken into consideration when transiting the OWW. Lock Restrictions may be in place at the time due to low water levels in Lake Okeechobee. The following restrictions are in effect as of 5 June 2014.

<b>The following tables are the WP Franklin and St Lucie Locks restrictions corresponding to lake level (FT)</b>	<b>Action for Lockage</b>	<b>ST Lucie Lockage Time</b>	<b>W P Franklin Lockage Time</b>
Greater than 12.5	On Demand	0700 -1900	0700 -1900
12.5 to 11.5	Lock every 2 hours	0700, 0900, 1100, 1300, 1500, 1700, 1900	0700, 0900, 1100, 1300, 1500, 1700, 1900
11.5 to 10.5	3 Lockages per day	0700, 1300, 1900	0700, 1300, 1900
10.5 to 9.0	2 Lockages per day	0900 & 1600	0900 & 1600
less than 9.0	1 Lockage per day	1200	1200
