## **Designated Critical Habitat**

Leatherback sea turtle: The waters adjacent to Sandy Point, U.S. Virgin Islands, up to and inclusive of the waters from the hundred fathom curve shoreward to the level of mean high tide with boundaries at 17°42'12"N and 64°50'00"W.

Elkhorn and Staghorn Corals (*Acropora*): All waters in the depths of 98 ft (30 m) and shallower to the mean low water (MLW) line in St. John/St. Thomas, U.S.V.I.; and the MLW line in St. Croix, U.S.V.I. Within these specific areas, the essential feature consists of natural consolidated hard substrate or dead coral skeleton that are free from fleshy or turf macroalgae cover and sediment cover.
