ADDITIONAL INFORMATION SUPPORTING NJD (e.g., paragraph 1 – site conditions; paragraphs 2-3 – rationale used to determine NJD, including information reviewed to assess potential navigation or interstate commerce connections; and paragraph 4 – site information on waters of the U.S. occurring onsite): The site encompasses a marginal, herbaceous system mainly vegetated with sedges and grasses but supporting a limited number of trees (along the western edge). The system hydrology is *extremely* degraded and the system appears to be strictly hydrated through rainfall and adjacent commercial runoff. The site is surrounded by commercial development and there is no hydrological connection to any other waters off site. The site, even with recent rainfall, was only marginally wet. There were not signs of wildlife use other than some geckos and the calls of a few songbirds, which might have easily been perched within offsite trees.
