### **1. DESCRIPTION**

The Inspection of Completed Works (ICW) program includes the inspection of federal flood control projects which have non-federal sponsors responsible for operation, maintenance, repair, replacement, and rehabilitation (OMRR&R) or as otherwise specified in Project Cooperation Agreements (PCA), Local Cooperation Agreements (LCA), and other agreements based on Section 221 of the Flood Control Act of 1970 (PL) 91-611) or other legislation. The primary purposes of these inspections are to prevent loss of life and catastrophic damages; preserve the value of the Federal investment; and to encourage non-Federal sponsors to bear responsibility for their own protection. This program is to assure sponsor compliance with existing agreements that the structures and facilities constructed by the United States for flood protection will be continuously maintained in such a manner and operated at such times and for such periods as may be necessary to obtain the maximum benefits. District program includes above listed Congressional Districts, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

#### **4. STATUS**

The O&M funding allocated for this fiscal year will be utilized to conduct coordinated inspections on the most critical aspects of the system which contains 1100 miles of levees and 300 structures. The potential exists for additional inspections on Federal projects in Puerto Rico. New guidance and direction from Headquarters is increasing the cost of the levy inspection program. The funding in FY 2016 is inadequate to support the District's efforts to comply with the HQ direction on levee inspections.
